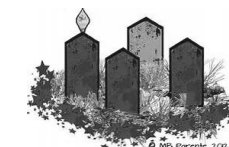

So, we begin with our longing, our desire and our hope.

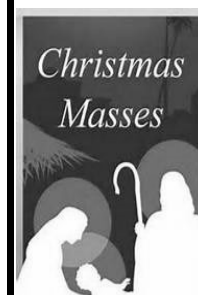
**Come, Lord Jesus! Come and visit your people.
